Math Idea:

Play "Top It." Use a deck of cards, remove Jack, Queen, King and Ace. Shuffle cards. Place them in one pile. Each player takes a card from the top of the pile, turns it over, and says the number on the card. The player who has the larger number takes both cards. If the two cards show the same number, each player takes another card from the top of the pile. The player with the larger number takes all of the cards facing up. The game is over when all of the cards have been taken. The player with the most cards wins. This game can be played with 2-4 players (add another deck for more players).

Play scrambled sentences. With your child, write a sentence on a piece of paper. Cut up the sentence word by word. Put the sentence back in the correct order. Write more sentences! Time yourself putting the sentence back together! Write and cut up two sentences to put back together!
